Spa Visits: In 2003, there were approximately 136 million spa visits made in the U.S. Sixty-percent (60%) of these were to day spas, while 27% visited resort/hotel spas. The remaining 13% are spread across the other four spa types.

Revenues: The U.S. spa industry generated an estimated \$11.2 billion in revenues in 2003. On average, half (52%) of a spa's revenue is derived from treatment rooms. Resort/hotel spas, despite the size of the segment, account for an impressive 41% of industry revenue while the largest segment, day spas, accounts for just under half (49%).

Employment: An estimated 280,700 people are employed by the U.S. spa industry. Fifty-one percent (51%) of these employees are full-time, 34% are part-time and 15% are on contract. Employee wages and salaries totaled approximately \$4.9 billion in 2003.

TUITION

The total tuition is prior to graduation. This amount includes required books, student kit, carrying case and linen usage. If needed, a payment plan is available.

EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES & RESOURCES

Basali' Dermal Institute classrooms and practical treatment areas are equipped with state of the art spa equipment such as multi-service treatment chairs, electrical equipment, steamers, derma-scopes, manicuring and pedicuring stations and back bar inventory for student use.

The classrooms are equipped with student tables and chairs, dry erase board, TV, DVD player and VCR player. Additional "in-school" equipment includes computers and overhead projector for presentations.

Basali' also has a library of current industry books and videos available to students during scheduled school hours. Administration is available to students for any questions or concerns regarding educational progress, feedback and professional growth.

CLIENT SERVICES

Students at the Institute provide an array of spa and clinical services to Basali' clients under supervision by a licensed instructor. These services consist of a multitude of facial treatments, body services, hair removal, makeup artistry, manicuring and pedicuring.

INSTRUCTOR/STUDENT RATIO

Basali' Dermal Institute is committed to providing quality education and one-on-one training with the instructors. Therefore, we commit to a 10:1 student to instructor ratio.

STUDENT HOUSING

Basali' Dermal Institute does not own a student dormitory. Please speak with an admissions representative for a list of affordable nearby living arrangements.

ACADEMIC STANDARDS & GRADING SCALE

Basali' guarantees monthly progress reports providing feedback on students' educational development. If a student experiences challenges in meeting the minimum performance standards and course requirements as set by Basali' and the State of Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing, they may meet with their instructor for guidance on educational improvement. Students will be evaluated on written exams, practicing safety and sanitation procedures with practical services, projects, and a final written and practical examination. Students must maintain a grade point average of 76% or higher to graduate from the program.

If at any point during the program, the student's progress falls below 76%, they will be placed on a 30-day academic probation. During the probationary period, the student is provided the opportunity to improve their status using a plan devised by the student and instructor. If at the end of the academic probation the student's grade point average does not improve to meet Basali's standards, the student may be expelled from the program. Students may not re-enroll in their current program or pick up from where they left off in a future program if they are expelled due to failure during the probationary period. If the student wishes to take the program, they will need to re-enroll in a new program from the beginning. All exams and quizzes can be made up or retaken if the grade is 76% or lower. There is a limit of one retake. Make up hours, retakes of school exams or quizzes, clinical or practical exams or any other incomplete assignments should be completed and submitted for grading before the last scheduled class. A \$25 fee for special staff assistance time may be charged. An entire class section may be repeated on a space-available basis and by paying an additional pro-rated tuition. Special individual tutoring may be arranged based on instructor availability. A fee of \$12 per hour may be charged and must be paid before tutoring begins.

ATTENDANCE

All absences must be made up. Make up sessions are designed to maintain student understanding and integrity of the coursework. Sessions may include but are not limited to, viewing pertinent videos, copying teacher transparencies and or notes, study hall, clinical make ups, papers and projects. Only 30 program hours may be made up in this manner. Permission may be granted by the director of education in unusual circumstances to exceed this cap. Failure to maintain 100% attendance or to make up missed program hours will result in ineligibility for graduation. Arriving after the start of class results in tardiness. Tardiness is calculated as follows:

1 – 15 minutes tardy = 15 minutes

16 – 30 minutes tardy = 30 minutes

31 + minutes tardy = 1 hour 30 minutes equals 30 minutes 31 minutes equals 1 hour.

STUDENT COMPLAINTS

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE

Basali' Dermal Institute prepares students for employment by offering a strong basis of business building skills, theoretical and technical knowledge. Personal assistance is provided to students to help with identifying the best employment opportunities, however Basali' is unable to guarantee job placement.

STUDENT RECORDS

Basali will not violate student's privacy or other rights, including their right to inspect and review educational progress reports, attendance and financial records, and all components of their personal files to ensure accuracy. Students should schedule an appointment with administration to review their file.

Student records are kept confidential. Basali' Dermal Institute will not release any information to anyone other than the student regarding attendance, progress, financial records, enrollment status, transcripts, and disciplinary actions without the student's written authorization.

All student records are kept for five years after graduation. Thereafter, records will be kept electronically in our student software system.

GRADUATION

To graduate and receive a transcript, diploma and completion of state licensing paperwork, students must:

1. Complete the number of hours required of the program
2. Maintain a GPA of 76% or higher
3. Complete in full, all tuition fees one month prior to graduation
4. Complete a student exit interview

*Students must graduate from Basali' Dermal Institute before taking the Wisconsin state licensure examinations.

WISCONSIN LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

To receive a license in Wisconsin for Aesthetics and Manicuring, students must:

1. Successfully complete the required amount of hours as stated by Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing
2. Successfully pass a written and practical examination conducted by Continental Testing Services at an assigned testing site.

*Application fees are required to apply for all examinations.

*Please note, other states have different licensing and hour requirements than Wisconsin. If you are interested in becoming licensed in another state, please contact that state to receive licensing information and requirements or contact the Institute's admissions department for information.

Students are expected to conduct themselves in a professional manner when interacting with staff, clients and other students. The student code of conduct is intended to promote a professional atmosphere and ensure a positive educational experience for everyone. The following behaviors are unacceptable and may result in termination from the Institute based upon administrative discretion:

1. Students must abstain from alcohol or drug use during all school hours.
2. Students may not engage in negative or violent behavior, including harassment, offensive, abusive or derogatory actions. Students must respect the rights of all employees, students and clients of Basali'.
3. Smoking is not allowed in the building or on premises at any time.
4. Students may not refuse any assigned service. Such action will result in a one day dismissal.
5. Students are responsible for security of their personal items and student kit.
6. Stealing or cheating is grounds for immediate termination of the program.
7. Students are responsible for safety and sanitation of their school environment in classroom and on practical floor.

Policy violations may result in a formal written warning or termination of the program. If a student is terminated, he/she may formally appeal in writing to administration. An interview with a school administrator and instructor is also required before a decision is rendered. All individual cases are handled separately. A student may be required to complete a course of instruction in another program if their appeal is accepted.

DRESS CODE

1. All students must maintain a neat and professional dress code at all times.
2. Basali' attire is required at all times during any practical work with students and clients. The attire must be clean, neat and ironed.
3. Black pants or skirts, no shorter than two inches above the knee, are required.
4. A solid color top may be worn during classroom hours. Professional guidelines are as follows:
 - Professional attire only
 - No off -the-shoulder tops
 - Cleavage, abdomen or back may not be shown
5. Shoes must be all black or all white and in good condition. Comfortable shoes preferred.
6. Hair must be pulled back when practicing student services and jewelry must be removed during practical services.
7. Nails must be free of chips, polished, well groomed, neat and cleaned.
8. Makeup should be applied in a professional manner.
9. Smoke odor must be eliminated from body, hair and clothing.
10. Students must practice good personal hygiene.

*Professional dress code is based upon administration and instructors discretion.

CANCELLATION NOTICE

Students may cancel their enrollment by submitting a formal written notice to Administration. Please hand-deliver or mail the notice with a return receipt requested, to the address listed on your enrollment contract.

CONSTRUCTIVE NOTICE POLICY

A student will be considered withdrawn by the school due to failure to attend class, utilize instructional facilities or submit lessons without providing (prior to or during current period) an explanation/notice to the school regarding their inactivity after three days. The postmark date on the written notification, or the date of the given notice to Administration is the official withdrawal date of the student.

BREACH OF CONTRACT
